The Bread Companions Project in Zandspruit

Thursday 26th of January marked a very momentous milestone for the community of Zandspruit, as it marked the foundation being laid for the building that will serve as a kitchen to bake bread, as well house the community's first ever solar oven. Bread Companions in partnership with Sesego Cares and Northcliff Rotary Club are ecstatic that this eagerly awaited project has kicked off. The Bread Companions project, which will form part of the Enjontheni Community Centre, will see the installation of a solar oven that has the capacity of baking up to 1000 loaves of bread a day. The solar oven that was imported from United States of America was sponsored by Sesego Cares and has safely arrived in the country with all logistics being managed by the members of the Northcliff Rotary Club. The building that will house the oven and serve as workstations for the bread baking was designed by 2 young and talented Architects, Dirk Coetzee and John Saaman. The building is being built from recycled material making it economically and environmentally friendly. The construction is scheduled to be completed by end of March 2011. The building material has been largely sponsored in the form of donations from Northcliff Rotary Club and sponsorship from various business entities. PPC Cement sponsored 120 bags of cement. Twelve members of the Zandspruit, who have already been selected and trained in business management, will use the building as their business center for baking bread for community.
